We are saddened by the loss of Sheila who founded the Friendship Hour some twenty five years ago and who put so much time into the running of the chapel. Her health had been failing for awhile and this year she had spent more time in hospital than at her home in Rudge Grove; nevertheless, she remained bright and cheerful, always delighted to see us, and ready with anecdotes from the past and present.

During her nursing career Sheila worked in nine hospitals and was matron at three boarding schools. She had many happy memories of them all but particularly of her time on Christopher Robin Ward in Hereford Hospital where she enjoyed looking after the children. One of the highlights of her life was meeting Queen Elizabeth, the Queen Mother in 1971 and the commemorative photograph was always on show in her living room.

Sheila's constant companion over many years was Monty, best described as a cat with attitude. He was fiercely loyal to her and rejected any affection from other people. Successfully re-homed, he now lives near Gloucester where he is special friends with an elderly collie.

The service for Sheila was held in Marden Chapel which was full to capacity. She was born in Smethwick in 1933 and came from a large family, most of whom were able to attend, and five members individually took active roles in the celebration of her life. The sun shone, the singing was worthy of a fine male voice choir and the scent of spring flowers filled the air both indoors and out.

Sheila is now laid to rest in Marden churchyard not far from her parents.

## Marden Junior Skaters To Play For Team GB

This July Great Britain will send its first ever team to the Junior Roller Derby World Cup in America and three Marden girls have been chosen to play on the team; Izzy Farkas, Marianne and Verity Corrick-Gough, along with the youngest qualified referee in Europe, Amelia Corrick-Gough. The team need to raise £20,000 to take twenty players to the event in Philadelphia and selectors have chosen seven Hereford Poison Berries, a team of under 18 girls and boys. In 2017, selected Poison Berries played at the MRDA (Men's Roller Derby Association) Championships, as England Juniors in Peterborough and wowed the crowds (and BBC viewers) at the adult Roller Derby World Cup in Manchester.

Roller Derby is a very exciting game, originating in America and is a sport led by women, with lots of men's and mixed junior teams too. Two teams battle to score points by having a designated player, the 'Lead Jammer', pass through the opposing team's defence. It is a full-contact sport and the players wear substantial protection, as things can get rough! Juniors work safely through levels until they get to Level 3, which is the same standard as the adult team.

## The Wildside of Marden

At the Wildlife meeting in Marden in May a gentle quiet, knowledgeable lady called Mary Walters came and told us about bees. A few of us are now identifying the different bees. Many of them, though they seem to be together when trying to find a nest, are actually solitary bees of which there are over 250 different types. The honey bee is of only one type and this is the only one to swarm in the UK. I was fascinated to learn about cuckoo bumble bees who wait for the other bees to do the work and then pop their eggs in to be raised by the workers of the nest. There are also cuckoo wasps but they kill the wasps including the queen in the nest and lay their eggs who then feed off the developing grubs. Amazing! Well we all know, the bird, the cuckoo, who likes to lay its eggs in another birds nests and its offspring then kicks out the other birds young so the young cuckoo can be reared by its adopted parents. As predicted I heard the cuckoo for the first time just after I had submitted the last article. I thought it was on the 16<sup>th</sup> April but definitely on the 18<sup>th</sup> April. However I don't think there are as many around but I have seen one and hear it most days but not for long.

As I travel about or look out of my window I often notice birds on the wires. At this time of the year, mostly swallows but again I think the numbers are less. I have also noticed flitting about martens, house and sand and in the last few weeks with the arrival of the warmer days the swifts, with their incredible flight as they zoom about the skies only ever landing on horizontal surfaces such as rocks or buildings. At dusk on the wires I have seen the round ball of the little owl or the bigger oval of the tawny owl. Then flying low over the hedges barn owls. The hedges have just burst into flowers on and under them. Cow parsley has grown feet tall and the spring bulbs have just about faded away. The insects are growing in numbers and the aphids are here so bring on the ladybirds. So many ladybirds have hibernated in the church this winter that I have spent a while trying to rescue as many as possible to put outside to find food. There are still many dried up dead bodies about along with the large bumble bee, red admiral butterfly or queen wasp that couldn't escape. The bats are back and they are now able to hunt well for the insects.

I went on a reptile half day with the HWT at Bodenham Lakes where we were looking for grass snakes. Nigel Hand 'the expert' would suddenly dive into a bush and come out with a grass snake to show us and then we saw a few more including one that was in a shallow pool feasting itself on tadpoles. He said there is a healthy population of grass snakes in the area. We set up refuges and one snake has used one and a pair of mating slow worms another. As I have spent the last few days chatting to people I have heard a few snake stories. At one place they had seen a pair of writhing hissing grass snakes mating. Another has many grass snakes as well as the odd adder or two. She found one adder basking on the patio in the sun so she shut the dog in and waited for it to go away on its own accord. The adder will only bite if disturbed and it does not always release venom. One lady had a lovely pond of fish that all got eaten by an enormous grass snake, can't blame that one on the otter. One of the predators of the snake is the buzzard of which we have plenty but I was mildly surprised to learn that another is the pheasant. Perhaps not such the stupid bird we seem to encounter trying to cross the road or more likely run into the road in the path of oncoming vehicles. I saw a cock pheasant sitting motionless by the side of the road and he did not move as I passed. I went back to check to see if he was there but he had gone but I discovered he had been sitting on a dead female and so perhaps he was having a moment of mourning.

Even if amphibians and the slithering snake are not your cup of tea still come along to the next Marden Branch of the HWT on the 6<sup>th</sup> June at 7pm as Nigel Hand will be speaking about our native creatures of the reptile and amphibian world and he really is very interesting.

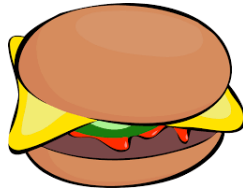
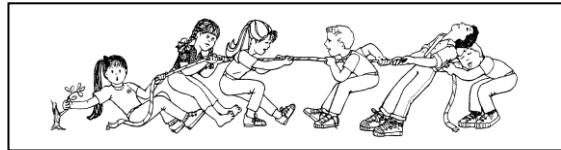
# Marden Community Facilities – fit for the future
